Let's pray,

Father, thank you for the power of your word. As we look briefly at it now, we ask that you will speak to our hearts, and also

prompt us to dwell on it more deeply in our homes. We ask in Jesus name. Amen

Lock down has lent us all more time so I hope we have been using it well, deepening our knowledge of the Word, spending more time in prayer, not just watching the television. Although sometimes that can be useful. For example this week on the news channels there was mention of the iconic film 'The good, the bad and the ugly'.

The film title is a useful summary of the parable of the weeds. The parable comes, along with others, at a pivotal point in Matthew's gospel. All the parables are a powerful picture, with evocative imagery which summarises disclosure and opposition. They are a sort of hinge on which this gospel turns. The bigger picture is revealed, who is Jesus, what is his purpose, and crucially how do we respond to him? All the parables in chapter 13 are Christ centred. They point to the Jesus who reveals and conceals and they prompt us to consider our own relationship with the living God.

The parable of the weeds is particularly challenging. We see in it that the good, the bad and the ugly have to occupy the same space. Under the cover of darkness the enemy sows his weeds in amongst the good seeds of the field. The result being, good occupies the space along with the bad and the inevitable ugly result, the fall out of sin. We are informed that this situation will be so until the time of harvest, when the good will be gathered in to the Father's barn and the bad bundled up and burned.

The field is the world we live in. We are sons and daughters of the kingdom living alongside those who choose to go their own way, who willingly embrace the ugliness of evil and sin. There is always going to be collateral damage, it is the fallout of free will.

The current pandemic is an extreme example of living in a fallen world where a virus can cause untold damage and harm.

What is our response? As sons and daughters of the kingdom we are called to trust, believe and hold on to our Lord in both the good times and the bad times. We must never lose sight of the fact that our Father created the world to be good.

His goodness permeates the world we live in, it overcomes the bad and the ugly and the evil. The creator loves his creation and us. He has blessed us, guarded us and kept us, but all within the framework of free will. So things will go wrong, like at the moment when most of us are still reeling from the current situation and it's attendant difficulties. Like times in our lives when we face challenging situations which leave us bereft, sad and struggling. All we can do in these times is hang on and remind ourselves that the darkness will not have the last word. Despite the fallout of sin, mishap and misfortune and pandemic God is a constant certainty. God is for us and ultimately nothing can stand against us if we have placed our trust in him.

One day our good creator will lead us home and to a place where we will finally understand those things that have hurt us, puzzled us, or derailed us. "then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their father. He who has ears let him/her hear" Amen.
