Bible Reading: Ephesians 1: 15-23 read by Lynne

Let's pray,
Father we ask that you will speak to our hearts and minds as we think about these verses today. We ask in Jesus' name.
Amen.

Surprise, it's me again. Life is full of surprises isn't it, some we expect some we don't. For example, this week I was expecting to be surprised. If you were in church or heard me talk last week, you might remember that I said that people may not have verses from Chronicles as favoured verses. I knew as I was saying it that I would be reading Chronicles this week and in all probability The Lord would spring a verse on me. The verse, my friends, that spoke to me was in the midst of the genealogies. "He answered their prayers, because they trusted him". Also, I was reminded of the prayer of Jabez.

This morning prayer is high on the agenda too. Paul tells his church friends that he hasn't missed a day of praying for them all. He says, "I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers". Then we learn how Paul prays. I don't know about you, but I think Paul is top of the charts in the prayer department. He prays things like this, "I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better". Wow, what a prayer to pray for anyone. Then my favourite part of his prayer and maybe yours too. "I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and his incomparably great power for us who believe".

Paul goes on to explain the origins of that power which is totally mind blowing and brings us back to Christ where earlier in the chapter we were reminded of his blessings, the great plan of redemption, and of the cross. We read at the end of the reading today, "And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way".

There is so much in these verses, so many avenues to explore, and of course so little time. But we all have the mind of Christ so we will fill this time with thoughts that can glorify him.

I don't know where your focus is today, but as I prepared, the focus for me was on hope, enabling and filling. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are called to be hopeful. There are no hopeless places in Christ. Look in any concordance and you will find verses of hope for any and every situation. Some are more useful than others, because let's face it most of us haven't got the patience of Job so we are quite unlikely to say what he said, "though he slay me, yet will I hope in him". We will probably be much more comfortable with verses like proverbs 23:18 "There is surely a future hope for you, and your hope will not be cut off."

We are so privileged to serve a God who gives us hope now, and also for the future. No matter what unfolds in our life we have that promise in Christ. I don't know what your current hope is, I don't know what situations everyone is facing, but I do know, even if you think it is hopeless, it is not. Grab hold of the hope you have in Christ this morning, don't let go. Remember this, Christ will enable you.

We are all enabled by the greatest helper ever. The comforter, dwelling in the Holy Spirit will lift us to heavenly places even in the storms of life. If we open our eyes to Christ, if we fix our

eyes on him, guided by the Holy Spirit, we will be more than conquerors and over-comers in Christ. However, let's be honest, sometimes life gives us such a kick we are unable to help ourselves. This is where, as a church, we move in with prayer, help, comfort, concern, and steadfast faith. We help our brothers and sisters in their time of need, and we can also expect to be helped in ours.

We can do this because we can all be filled by Christ. Paul says in Romans 15:13 "May the God of hope fill you all with joy and peace, so that you may overflow with hope, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Let's pray this week that every one of us will be filled with hope, filled with Christ, and filled with his spirit. Amen.
